**Amaretti biscuits** – makes 50 (served at the Group Meeting)

4 large egg whites

350g caster sugar

350g ground almonds

30ml amaretto liqueur/almond essence

- 1. Preheat oven to 170/ gas 3 and line 2 baking sheets
- 2. In a bowl, whisk the egg whites until firm. Gently fold in the sugar, almonds and essence.
- 3. Using a teaspoon, place dollops of the mix on the trays 2cm apart
- 4. Bake for 10 to 15 minutes until lightly golden. Transfer to rack to cool.

In front of us were templates of a bird and on a separate table squares of coloured felt, lots of coloured embroidery threads and lots and lots of pots with multi coloured sequins, beads and all sorts of wonderful sparkly shapes for us to choose from. Sue gave us some background history of the concept of the birds which were originally conceived in Russia. She then showed us some birds she had made which were exquisite and explained how to cut, decorate and sew the birds.
