Tour of Javelin Park Incinerator 30th Jan 2024



Twenty two members arrived for a 10 O'clock start at the site. After signing in at Reception we were taken by lift to the Classroom where we were shown to coffee making facilities before we settled down for our pre tour talk by Mel, also our guide.

Mel gave us a brief history of the site and explained that the site was named Javelin Park as it stood on the original RAF Moreton Valance site where Javelins, Meteors and Typhoon aircraft were once tested. In fact the old runway now runs underneath the actual M5.

Construction began in 2016 and completed in July 2019 when Gloucestershire Energy from Waste started generating electricity that month. It generates enough electricity to power 25000 homes, which Mel added is a bonus, because the main purpose of the Park is to deal with waste.

On a normal day the site employs 48 people, with only 3 at night and weekends.

Normal operations begin with a waste truck arriving and reversing into one of the Bunker bays and tipping its load into a vast cavern. This waste is then lifted and dropped down the feed chute and onto the combustion grate. Here it is dried then burnt at more than 850degrees. Ash falls through the grate, leaving ferrous and nonferrous metals that are recovered, sorted and then sold. The bottom ash that remains is used as Construction aggregate. In another part of the plant, high pressure steam is fed to a turbine, connected to a generator which generates electricity. This is exported to the Western Power grid. We were reassured that it is mostly steam coming from the tall chimney, with allowed emissions well within Environment Agency rules.

We were amazed by the sheer scale of the Park, sometimes quite dizzying looking down through grid floors and steps. We all felt that we had learned a great deal and thoroughly enjoyed our time at Javelin Park.

To round off the morning some of us adjourned to La Campagna in Stonehouse for a delicious Italian lunch. Great service and great food.
